Three Things to help our White-Tailed Deer get through the Winter season

1) Do Not Feed Them

Backyard deer feeding may seem like a pleasant way for SRP-W residents to connect with nature. However, deer are wild animals so artificially feeding them can actually harm them. They have very sensitive stomachs that are accustomed to the natural foods they have been eating for thousands of years. As such they are not able to digest human processed food or scraps from your kitchen. Feeding deer any corn or bread, which is full of starch, can disrupt the delicate balance of their stomach microbiome, causing them to vomit or get diarrhea.

2) Do Not Feed Them

Feeding a few deer can quickly lead to more coming into your yard looking for handouts. This concentrates an unnaturally high number of deer in close contact, which increases the chance of disease being spread amongst the herd. One very serious issue is Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) which is fatal to deer as it attacks their nervous system. The disease is currently affecting deer in Pennsylvania and the longer we can keep it out of SRP-W, the better.

One illness that humans can contract easier from higher deer populations is Lyme Disease. Deer are a host species of ticks which spread the bacteria which then causes the Lyme infection. You may get sick and think you just have the flu. However, increased Lyme symptoms of fatigue and joint pain in residents are a possibility with increased deer populations.

3) Do Not Feed Them

Feeding deer will upset the herd numbers and bring in larger populations in our community and closer to the ClubHouse garden projects. Here they can easily devour the plants and subsequent hard work of the Garden Committee's volunteers. Large numbers of deer also result in greater plant damage in residents' yards.

Also, according to AAA yearly data every year more than 30,000 car accidents occur in NJ that involve hitting (or being hit by) a deer. So every time you see a dead deer near the road; think of someone's car in the repair shop; or worse, think of the driver of that car possibly in the hospital. Nature has been providing precisely what is needed for deer to have a healthy population and get through the winter without any handouts from us residents.

If you know of a resident who is harming our deer by artificially feeding them, you can anonymously call Berkeley Township Animal Control (732) 797-1413. They will send someone out to educate that person.

Silver Ridge Park Westerly Automated Trash & Recycling Program

Frequently Asked Questions

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF MOVING TO AUTOMATED TRASH COLLECTION?

Automation is a faster and a more efficient way to collect residential solid waste. Additionally, other towns that have moved to automated collection have reported an increase in recycling rates and an overall reduction in the amount of trash collected. The hinged lids help to keep rainwater out of the cans, reduce trash weight, and are animal-proof as well. In addition to anticipated time and cost savings, the program will help keep our neighborhoods neat and clean, improve safety on residential streets, and provide safer working conditions for trash collectors. Cans are durable and easy to maneuver.

WILL CURRENT EMPLOYEES LOSE THEIR JOBS?

NO! This plan is not in place to lay off any public works employees.

IS THERE A COST FOR THE NEW CANS?

Your first trash and recycling cans are free. There will be a cost to purchase any additional cans.

WHAT ARE THE SIZES OF THE NEW CANS?

Berkeley Township is offering one (1) sixty-five (65) gallon trash and one (1) sixty-five (65)-gallon recycling can. Residents may request a ninety-five (95) gallon can in advance. Please note a sixty-five (65) gallon can holds 4-5 tall kitchen trash bags and a ninety-five (95) gallon can holds 7-8 tall kitchen trash bags.

CAN I ORDER ADDITIONAL CANS?

For an additional cost you may purchase up to one (1) more trash and or recycling can

WHEN WILL WE RECEIVE OUR NEW CANS?

Cans will be delivered to every home within Holiday City sometime after the new year. Appointments are not necessary, and you do not need to be home to receive your new trash can. If you travel during the winter, you may call the public works office at 732-349-4616 and put your trash can delivery on hold.

WHEN WILL THE AUTOMATED COLLECTION BEGIN?

You may start using your new can once it's delivered to you.

WHAT DO THE NEW CANS LOOK LIKE?

Berkeley Township has selected Burgundy, 65-gallon trash cans and Blue 65-gallon recycling cans. These cans will help to keep our residential streets neat and clean. All trash cans will have the Township logo on the side and will be linked to your address via a serial number embedded in the plastic.

CAN I USE THE CAN I ALREADY HAVE?

No. Only those cans provided by the Township will be collected. Cans other than those provided by the township will not be collected.

WHAT DO I DO WITH MY CAN IF I MOVE?

Trash/Recycling Cans are issued and owned by the Township and must remain at the property address to which they are assigned.

THE NEW CANS LOOK BIG. ARE THEY EASY TO WHEEL TO AND FROM THE CURB?

New Trash & Recycling cans are designed for weight distribution and safety. They are easy to maneuver empty and full. Most importantly they are senior friendly and roll easily on all types of terrain.

WHAT DO I DO WITH MY OLD TRASH CAN?

You may leave your old can at the curb, and it will be disposed of for you by the Department of Public Works.

ARE THE NEW CANS ANIMAL PROOF?

The new cans are the most animal proof available. If you store your can outside and encounter a problem with animals, you can use a bungee cord to secure the lid to the lift bar, but please remember to remove the bungee cord on your collection day or your can will not be emptied.

WILL MY COLLECTION DAY REMAIN THE SAME?

Yes. Your trash will continue to be collected weekly, and on the same collection day. Trash & Recycling cans are to be placed at the curb no earlier than the evening prior and no later than 6 am of your collection day.

WHAT IF MY CAN GETS DAMAGED?

Contact the Department of Public Works at (732) 349-4616 to report a damaged can.

WHAT SHOULD I DO WITH OVERFLOW TRASH THAT DOES NOT FIT INTO MY CAN?

Your new trash can accommodate as much volume as 2 to 3 standard-sized trash cans. We expect these cans to be sufficient for your household needs. If you have a one-time overflow of trash, please hold it until your next regular collection day or drop it off at the Ocean County Landfill. If you continue to have an overflow of trash or recycling, a second can should be purchased.

WILL I STILL RECEIVE BULK COLLECTION

Bulk Collection will be scheduled on an as needed basis. If you have items to put out for bulk, you may call the public works office at 732-349-4616 and schedule your bulk pick up.

HOW DO I PREPARE MY TRASH CAN FOR WEEKLY SET-OUT?

All trash must be bagged before being placed in the can. The lid to the can must close tightly. Your cans should be free of any obstacle such as mailboxes, telephone poles, vehicles, and any overhead obstructions. The can's handle and wheels are to face the house. The lids opening is to face the street. No material is

to be sticking out of the can. Trash and recycling cans are to be placed at the curb approximately three (3) feet apart from each other, and at least four (4) feet from any other obstacle.

WHAT IF I AM DISABLED?

Our disabled residents must provide a prescription provided by your doctor stating you are disabled and cannot walk your trash and recycling cans to the curb. Once we receive this prescription a team member from public works will bring your can to the curb to be emptied. Prescriptions must be renewed yearly and received by January 31. Extensions may be granted by calling the public works office.

WHAT HAPPENS IF MY COLLECTION DAY FALLS ON A HOLIDAY?

If your trash/recycling collection falls on a Holiday it will be delayed one (1) day. If your trash is not picked up, please leave it at the curb for the next day until the department catches up. The departments' goal is to be back on track within 24-48 hours of the holiday.

ARE THERE ANY ITEMS NOT PERMITTED FOR TRASH COLLECTION?

CHILI

BUTTERNUT SQUASH AND LENTIL CHILI

MAKES 6-8 SERVINGS

1. Dice your onion, garlic and jalapeño peppers. For less heat, remove the seeds from the peppers (also be careful not to touch your eyes after!)
2. Heat up a bit of olive oil in your pot and add the diced onion, garlic and peppers and sauté until onions are translucent.
3. Add the cut-up butternut squash, chili powder and some salt. Stir and brown the butternut squash until soft (add a bit of broth if everything is sticking to the bottom of the pan)
4. Add the remaining ingredients and stir. two (2) cups of broth or so, beans, lentils, paprika, dash of liquid smoke, a couple drizzles of BBQ sauce
5. Cover and reduce to a simmer. Simmer for 45 mins to an hour or until most of the liquid is reduced
6. Add more broth or a bit of water if desired and thicken the chili using a dash of flour




The Housing for Older Persons Act (HOPA) was signed into a Federal law on December 28, 1995. The law's intent is to validate occupancy that at least one person, age 55+ years of age or older lives in a residential retirement unit in a common interest community serving seniors. HOPA surveys are a NJ Law MANDATE and instruct all senior community HOA's to periodically collect and verify through census, the names, number of occupants, ages and birthdates of all occupants residing in a residential senior community unit. An age certification document from the HOA is required for Certificate of Occupancy in the municipality of Berkeley Township, New Jersey.




THANKSGIVING DINNER



THOUGHTFUL WAYS TO SAY ‘THANKS’ AT YOUR THANKSGIVING TABLE

ACTIVITIES TO REMIND YOUR FAMILY AND GUESTS THE REASON FOR THE DAY

Thanksgiving quickly brings to mind thoughts of savory turkeys, sweet pies, and other beloved sides that have been associated with this holiday over the years. With all the delicious dishes on the table aside most people would agree that this holiday is about more than the food. It's really all about gratitude, as the first celebrants of this day believed.

When the family gets together for a special holiday like Thanksgiving, there is often a blessing or special grace said before the meal begins. But since thanks is the focal point of the holiday, why not add another tradition or two that focuses on gratitude, a tradition that may become as special and anticipated as the pumpkin pie? To help you get started, here are a variety of ways you and your family can build on the thankful tradition of this feast.

Thankful Activities for the Whole Family

- **Saying Grace with Thanks.** If your family always says grace before beginning Thanksgiving dinner, you can easily create a thankful tradition by asking each person around the dinner table, in turn, to express their thanks for something that has occurred over the past year.
- **Pass the Gratitude Basket.** Give everyone a sheet of paper and a pencil. Then ask each person to write down one thing that makes them feel grateful and put it into a basket. Pass the basket around the table and have everyone read another person's paper, followed by the group guessing who wrote it.
- **Thanksgiving Show and Tell.** Ask everyone to bring along something that reflects what they are thankful for that year. Then each person, in turn, can share it with the group and tell their story. It might be an item, a photo, a song, or any other item that illustrates their point.
- **Read a Story About Thanksgiving.** Read a Thanksgiving book as a group. You can choose whether to read about the history of the original Thanksgiving, fictional stories about the day, or a book about ways for families to give thanks. This could be done as everyone waits for the meal to finish cooking. Or it could be a fun activity in between courses to give everyone a chance to digest. You can take turns reading the story and allow even the younger children a chance to show off their developing reading skills.
- **Have a Thanksgiving Sing-Along.** Download and sing one or all of these kid-friendly songs about

Thanksgiving that include old favorites as well as songs sung by contemporary artists for children.

- **Play a Thanksgiving Memory Game.** Go around the table and ask each person to name something that makes them feel thankful, but with a catch. Each individual must repeat the thanks of all the people who preceded them before adding their thanks to the list.
- **Thanks All Around.** Assuming your Thanksgiving table is filled with close friends and family, and not guests who are meeting one another for the first time, go around the table and invite each person to say why they're thankful for the person sitting next to them. It can be the person on their right, left, or even both sides.
- **Make a Thanksgiving Scrapbook.** Create a holiday scrapbook that will be more cherished as the years pass. Take a blank scrapbook and each year put in photos of the family and friends gathered that year; photos of all of the food served; add notes about special things that happened that day; recipes for the dishes and notes about who created each dish. Ask each person to write in the book what they are thankful for that year.
- **Thanks for the Memories.** Take out the Thanksgiving scrapbook and leave it within easy reach for everyone to enjoy reading and discussing favorite memories from past years.

Thankful Activities Just for the Kids

- **A Picture Says a Thousand Words.** Give the children paper and crayons and invite them to draw pictures of the things that they feel most grateful for this year.
- **Create a Thankful Mural.** Cover a wall with a large piece of kraft paper. Give the children crayons and ask them to draw pictures and words for those things which they are grateful.
- **Artful Turkeys.** Help the children create turkey pictures using their hands. Tell them (or help younger children) to write what they are thankful for on each feather, followed by coloring in the turkeys. When the turkeys are finished, the children can stand up and tell the group what's written on their feathers. Put these in your scrapbook as one of the memories for that year.

What's In - What's Out

In keeping with Berkeley Township shed ordinance, homeowners are permitted, effective immediately, to install one (1) shed on their property, up to and including 64 square feet.
(8' x 8' x 8')

Modification of existing shed policy 11h in the architectural Rules and Regulations was voted for, approved and has changed to:

1. Sheds may not be placed anywhere other than the rear of the home.
2. All sheds must remain within the sidelines of the home.
3. Sheds may NOT be installed on common ground property.
4. Said shed shall be of any structure material the homeowner desires.
5. Sheds that are required to be fastened must be on a firm ground structure. DO NOT place any shed on a cement slab. Cement slabs add square feet to your taxable living space and will be taxed by Berkeley Township.
6. In accordance with Berkeley Township ordinance, sheds must be placed at least three feet from the back of the property line.
7. Although Berkeley Township requires only a 3 foot side setback, SRP Westerly requires all shed placement to remain within the sidelines of the home.
8. In accordance with Berkeley Township ordinance, electrical wiring of sheds is not permitted.
9. If a homeowner chooses to install a shed against their home, it may not block any windows or doors.
10. Homeowners MUST submit an architectural approval request form along with a drawing showing the location of the proposed shed to the SR Westerly Architectural Committee. *(Architectural forms are available in your monthly copy of the Sign Post).*
11. The homeowner must submit a zoning permit application, required fees and forms to the Berkeley Township Town Hall /Zoning Office. *(Zoning Permit Application forms can be obtained from the Berkeley Township website or the Zoning Office.)*

- All work must be done Monday-Saturday, 8am-6pm. No work can be done on Sundays or Holidays.
