As always we are in need of volunteers for committees. We can't do this without everyones help. So whether you have a lot of extra time or a little we can always use the help.


Remember the speed limit in our neighbor is 25mph! As always stay safe, to our snowbirds safe travels and most of all be kind to one another.





The Ocean County Health Department's Chronic Disease and Immunization Department offers seasonal influenza vaccinations at various locations across the county. Getting your annual flu shot is one of the best ways to protect yourself, your loved ones, and your community from the spread of influenza.

Flu vaccine clinics are available at senior centers, libraries, community centers, and more, with daytime and evening hours to accommodate your schedule. In addition, pneumonia vaccines are available at select sites by appointment.

All people 6 months of age and older should get vaccinated against seasonal flu every year.

Children younger than 6 months are at high risk of serious flu illness but are too young to be vaccinated. People who care for them should be vaccinated instead.

Vaccination is especially important for pregnant women and people with chronic diseases.

The flu vaccine protects against several different flu viruses (strains). Flu vaccines are updated every year to better match the viruses circulating in the public.

Getting the flu vaccine cannot give you the flu! The vaccine is made with inactive (killed) virus strains, which are not infectious.



Thank you for the parcels, which arrived at BDSC (Baghdad Diplomatic Support Center), Iraq on 24 August 2025 and were opened and distributed by Red Cross Volunteers.

The joy on their faces to receive the CDs, DVDs, snacks and books was wonderful to see because there had not been any mail delivery for a few weeks.

My apologies that I did not take a photo of those service members who unpacked the boxes.

I do have a request. Inside the boxes were calling cards by Cell Phones for Soldiers, which are not applicable here. I will be returning them to you to pass them along.

We do not have a DVD player and a very small space within the Red Cross Office for tv/video watching. With respect, may we not have any more DVD/CDs sent? Apparently, the one DVD player we had was plugged into a 220V outlet without a transformer because a new person did not see it was 110V.

Thank you for sending us the boxes. We do not want you to think we don't appreciate the generosity of the donors, we have limited space and the ability to watch and listen to DVD/CDs.

Three things to help our White-Tailed Deer!

1) Do Not Feed Them

Backyard deer feeding may seem like a pleasant way for SRP-W residents to connect with nature. However, deer are wild animals so artificial feeding can actually harm them. They have very sensitive stomachs that are accustomed to the natural foods they have been eating As such they are not able to digest human for thousands of years. processed food or scraps from your kitchen. Feeding deer any corn or bread, which is full of starch, can disrupt the delicate balance of their stomach microbiome, causing them to vomit or get diarrhea.

2) Do Not Feed Them

Feeding a few deer can quickly lead to more coming into your yard looking for handouts. This concentrates an unnaturally high number of deer in close contact, which increases the chance of disease being spread amongst the herd. very serious issue is Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) which is fatal to deer as it attacks their nervous system. The disease is still currently affecting deer in Pennsylvania and the longer we can keep it out of SRP-W, the better.



3) Do Not Feed Them

Feeding deer will increase the herd population. More than 30,000 car collisions occur yearly in NJ that involve hitting (or being hit by) a deer. So every time you see a dead deer near the road; think of someone's car in the repair shop; or worse, think of the driver of that car possibly in the hospital. Nature has been providing precisely what is needed for deer to have a healthy population and get through the winter without any handouts from SRP-W residents.

If you know of a resident who is harming our deer by artificially feeding them, you can anonymously call Berkeley Township Animal Control (732) 797-1413. They will send someone out to educate that person.

In keeping with Berkeley Township shed ordinance, homeowners are permitted, effective immediately, to install one (1) shed on their property, up to and including 64 square feet. (8' x 8' x 8')


Modification of existing shed policy 11th in the architectural Rules and Regulations was voted for, approved and has changed to:

- 1. Sheds may not be placed anywhere other than the rear of the home.
- All sheds must remain within the sidelines of the home.
- Sheds may NOT be installed on common ground property.
- 4. Said shed shall be of any structure material the homeowner desires.
- 5. Sheds that are required to be fastened must be on a firm ground structure. DO NOT place any shed on a cement slab. Cement slabs add square feet to your taxable living space and will be taxed by Berkeley Township.
- 6. In accordance with Berkeley Township ordinance, sheds must be placed at least three feet from the back of the property line.
- 7. Although Berkeley Township requires only a 3 foot side setback, SRP Westerly requires all shed placement to remain within the sidelines of the home.
- 8. In accordance with Berkeley Township ordinance, electrical wiring of sheds is not permitted.

9. If a homeowner chooses to install a shed against their home, it may not block any windows or doors. 10. Homeowners MUST submit an architectural approval

request form along with a drawing showing the location of the proposed shed to the SR Westerly Architectural Committee. (Architectural forms are available in your monthly copy of the Sign Post).

11. The homeowner must submit a zoning permit application, required fees and forms to the Berkeley Township Town Hall /Zoning Office. (Zoning Permit Application forms can be obtained from the Berkeley Township website or the Zoning Office.)
