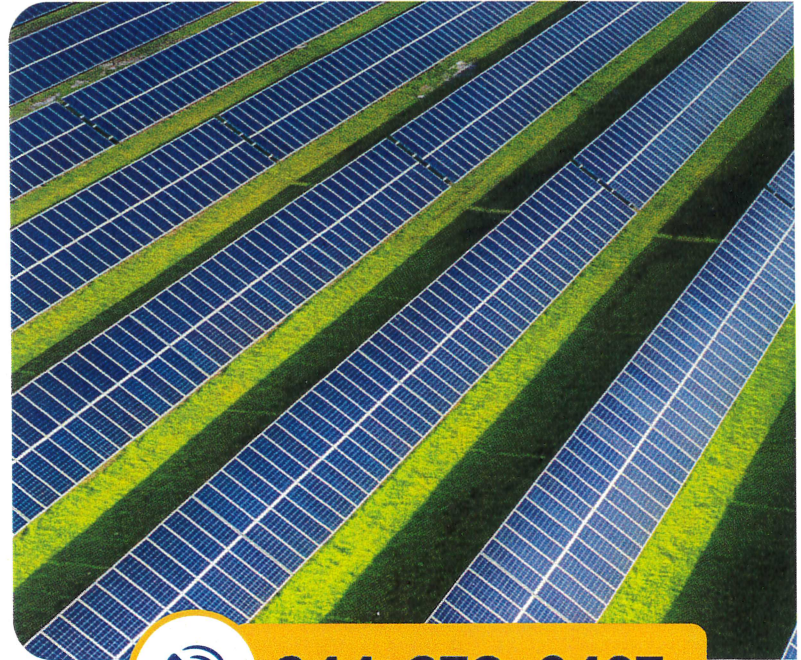

Think Community Solar will work to digitally connect your utility account with a community solar project. However, the timeline for connection will depend on your local utility company and the availability of projects. Solar credits will vary seasonally and may exceed your utility bill in summer months. Any excess credits applied to your utility bill will be applied each month until exhausted through the winter months. If solar credits do not offset 100% of your utility bill in any given month you will be responsible for paying the balance to your local utility company. Dear Berkeley Township Resident,

It is with great enthusiasm that I'm reaching out to share information about the New Jersey Community Solar Program (Bill Number A4782/S3123) and the state-approved solar project located in Berkeley Township and available to our residents.

Whether you rent or own your home, you can enroll in this program and start saving money with solar energy without installing panels on your roof. With community solar, you are assigned a share of the solar project and receive solar credits on your JCP&L electricity bill for the energy produced, reducing what you owe.

Berkeley Township residents can enroll right now and receive a 20% discount on their solar credits starting in February 2025. Your electricity service is still provided as normal by JCP&L -- there is no fee to enroll in the program, no installation on your property, and you can cancel any time without penalty.

To learn more or enroll, please follow the instructions on the back of this letter, you will need to provide a copy of your JCP&L recent bill.

A key goal of the New Jersey Community Solar Program is to make the benefits of solar available to everyone, and 51% of the project is reserved for low-to-moderate income residents. When you enroll, please let Think Energy know if you think you may qualify, and your enrollment will be prioritized and potentially eligible for an increased discount.

If you're interested in saving money with community solar, you have to act quickly -- enrollments are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis and enrolling now will reserve your space. We encourage you to take advantage today to save on your electricity bill.

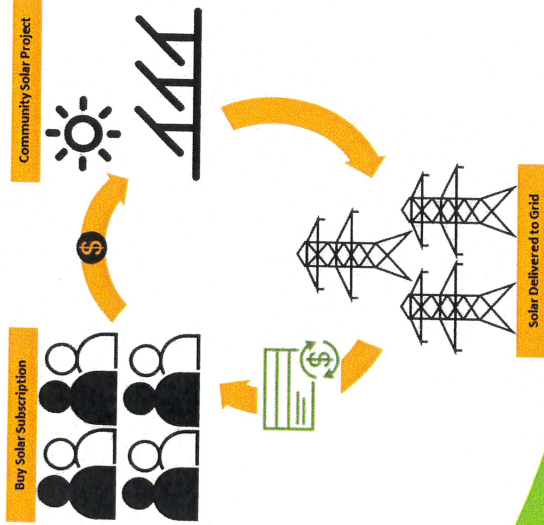


WHY COMMUNITY SOLAR?

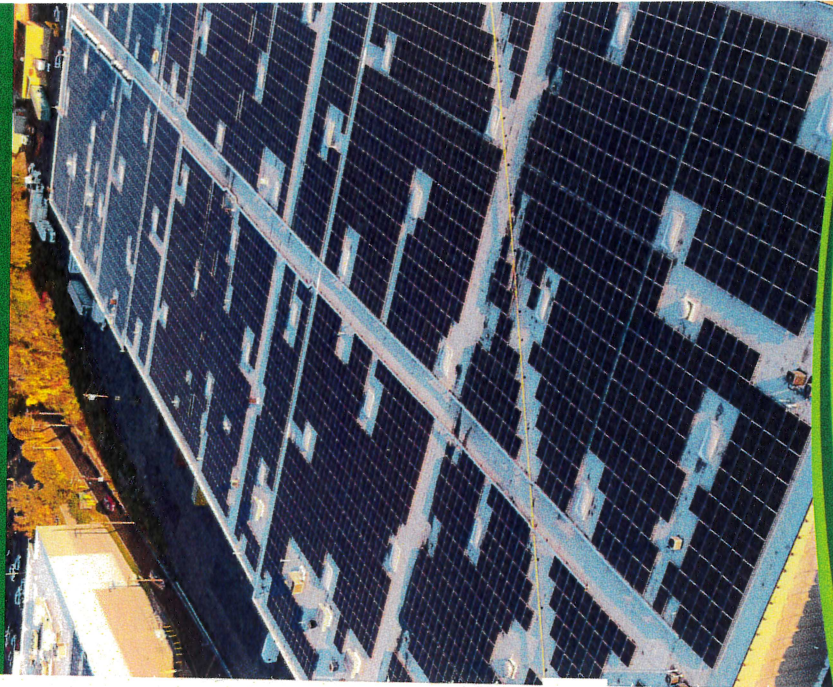

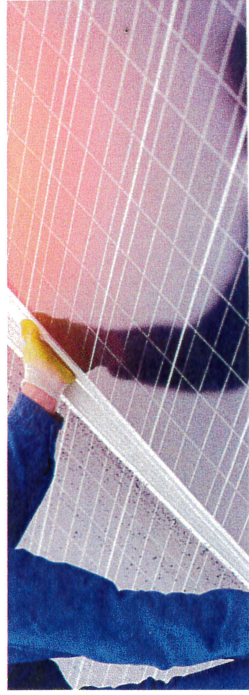

What is community solar?

A community solar project is a solar array whose output is virtually divided among multiple participants, known as subscribers. Subscribers receive a bill credit on their utility bill for their participation in a community solar project.

Subscribers are not directly connected to the solar array. They can be down the road, across town or even all the way across the state. All subscribers must be located in the same utility service area as the project to which they have subscribed. Community solar projects typically offer their subscribers a 15-25% discount on their electricity bills.

How big is a community solar project?

A project cannot be larger than 5MW. This could power up to 1,250 houses and an array could cover approximately 15-20 acres. There is no minimum size.

Each project must have at least 10 subscribers.

How many community solar projects are there?

As part of the Community Solar Energy Pilot Program, the Board approved 150 projects across New Jersey. Many of these are already producing clean energy for subscribers and others are under construction. The permanent community solar program will likely see over 100 new projects built every year.

Where can these community solar arrays go?

Rooftops, parking lots, brownfields, landfills and impervious surfaces are all great options for siting community solar.

Not all sites are suitable for solar due to shading, interconnecton and other factors.

Can anyone participate?

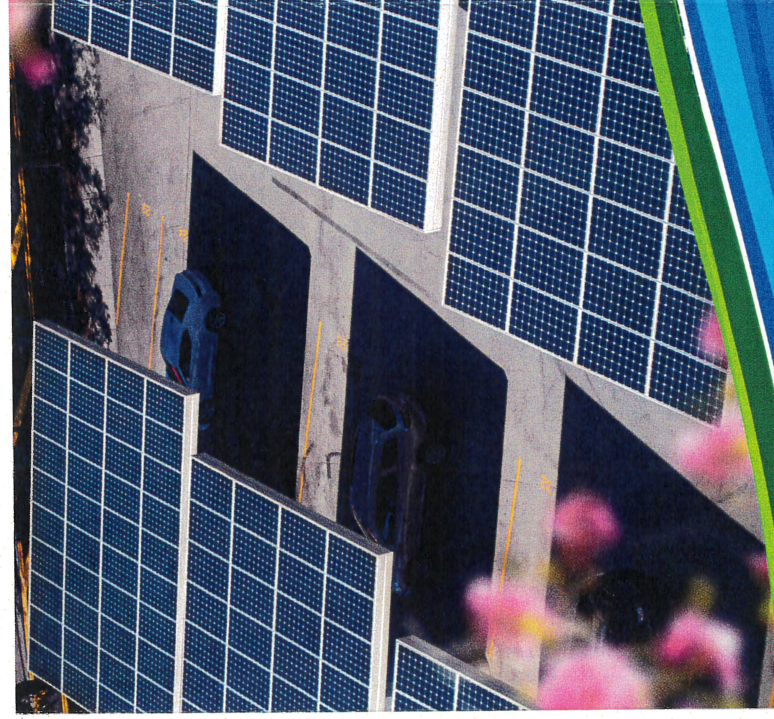
Yes! Anyone who is an electric utility customer in New Jersey can participate.

Who is involved in a project?

There are three primary roles for any community solar project:

- Site Host
- Developer
- Subscriber

Site Host

A site host has available space, such as a warehouse rooftop or a landfill site, that is well positioned to capture solar energy. The site may never have had a solar array or it may have additional area available adjacent to an existing array. A site host can partner with a developer and rent or sell the site used for the solar project.

Developer

The solar developer will be responsible for the application, building, and maintenance of the solar array. The developer may partner with a registered subscriber organization to sign up subscribers.

Subscriber

A subscriber can be a home or business that wants to use renewable energy but does not have an array on site. This may be because they are a renter or because their site is not optimal for an on-site solar system.

A subscriber pays a monthly subscription for a share of the project's solar power generation. Every project will have its own fees and contract. Be sure you read the contract and understand its terms and conditions before signing up.
